DOG LICENSE INFORMATION

If you own a dog that is 5 months of age or older (at any time throughout the year) and resides in Sawyer County more than 30 days, your dog is required by law to have an Annual Sawyer County Dog License. Dog licenses are available from the Town of Lenroot, however, **you must send a self-addressed stamped envelope to receive your dog tag**, or you may pick it up in person. Licenses are also available year-round from the Sawyer County Clerk's office located in the Sawyer County Courthouse – 10610 Main St., Hayward

\$10.00 for neutered or spayed dogs, \$15.00 for intact male or female dogs.

- **NEW** license: you NO LONGER NEED TO FILL OUT A CARD, BUT - **YOU MUST SEND A VET CERTIFICATE showing date of vaccination, expiration date, vaccine manufacturer and serial number of serum. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- **RENEWING** a license: You may go online **AFTER DECEMBER 15th** at <http://www.doglicenses.us/WI/Sawyer/>

FAILURE TO OBTAIN YOUR DOG'S LICENSE BEFORE APRIL 1st WILL RESULT IN LATE FEES AND POSSIBLE CITATIONS.

RECREATION RENTAL OWNERS

Town of Lenroot Accommodation Tax Ordinance #109 REQUIRES that ALL nightly and weekly rentals MUST PAY a 2% Accommodation Tax. This is due quarterly to the Town Treasurer within 30 days of the end of the quarter to support tourism promotion in our area.

2024 DECEMBER—TOWN OF LENROOT NEWSLETTER

Road projects last summer included a new concrete culvert on Porkey's road which was cost shared with Sawyer County. Also, sections of Company Lake Road, Nelson Lake Road, and Simons Road were resurfaced.

Anticipated projects for next summer include a cost shared resurfacing of parts of Sunset Road and Phipps Fire Lane Road, gravel crushing at the town shop pit, and resurfacing parts of other roads to be determined.

The revaluation of property values is to be completed by spring 2025 after which owners should receive information about the new assessment from the assessor. It is expected that most properties will increase in value, but overall, the amount of property tax should remain about the same.

The town purchased a parcel of land adjacent to Gerlach Landing parking lot. This was to secure ownership of the north edge of the existing parking lot and possibly expand the parking lot in the future. The Nelson Lake Association has requested that they be allowed to construct a storage building on the parcel to house the pontoon boat used to place buoys in the lake.

Carol Stone, the town clerk for the past 19 years retired in November. **THANK YOU CAROL, FOR YOUR MANY YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN OF LENROOT!** Robert Ubbelohde has been hired by the board as interim clerk until elections in April 2025. He can be reached at the Lenroot town hall.

The boat landing at the Nelson Lake Dam has been repaired. This work required the water levels to be lowered by 4' to be able to access the bottom cement pad and install an additional one hopefully to prevent further damage caused by power loading.

The Seeley Lions and their sister club, the Seeley Hills Club, have constructed a storage building on the old dump site on Old OO for storage of grooming equipment used on hiking/ski trails. This building was built by the clubs and is owned by the township. The Lions have also built a changing station at Silverthorn Park. These are but two examples of the cooperation of the Town of Lenroot with local non-profit organizations to develop facilities in the township for the benefit of every one.
